A meeting took place with the neighbourhood Inspector today and she has the following message to convey:

Police are aware of an increase in reports of anti-social behaviour in the streets around New York Primary School stretching over to the Tamar Close area. Additional patrols have been put in place and a number of youths who have been involved in the disorder have been identified and visited by police, these youths have been spoken to in company with their parents. Those identified as having been involved in criminal offences are being interviewed and could face prosecution. A multi-agency approach will be taken to tackling the issues raised by residents - police and council will be working alongside the school. Both agencies are working closely together and those persons involved could face action in relation to their tenancies.

I would like to take this opportunity to appeal to the residents to report any incidents to Police or North Tyneside Council. Please call Northumbria Police on 101 for any non-urgent incidents. Information can be passed to North Shields Neighbourhood Policing Team via e-mail at
