## Year 6 SafetyWorks Trip

On 20th January, Year 6 visited Safetyworks. They participated in 5 different activities simulating real life hazards and how to prevent them. These included Metro

safety, safety in the home, peer pressure and what to do if someone is unresponsive. We were shocked to learn that you can be arrested at just 10 years old and talked about peer pressure and what this might look like in day-to-day scenarios. We then looked inside a real police custody cell and talked about the numbers you call in an emergency. In an emergency always dial 999 - when someone is in danger, a crime is in progress or a suspect is nearby. 101 is the phone number to contact your local police, any time it isn't 999. 101 is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
