

Summer Term 2022 - Year 3

The Elephants and Lions





Did you know the Stone Age is the longest lasting time period in the human timeline?

English

During the term, we will be learning all about the Stone Age through a range of fictional texts including How To Wash A Woolly Mammoth and Stone Age Boy. We will learn how to write instructions, a portal tale and a non-chronological report.

We will continue to develop our phonological skills and spellings through daily Read Write Inc and Reciprocal Reading sessions as well as develop our love for reading with Accelerated Reader and Reading Plus sessions.

Maths

We will start the term by developing our knowledge of place value. We will then move anto further developing knowledge of fractions and begin to look at decimals. We will also continue to learn to tell the time, and measure mass and capacity. We will look at the properties of shape and continue daily practice of our times tables.

Science

We will begin our learning in Science focusing on rocks and fossils and how they are formed. We will investigate the rocks and soils in our local area and get hands on to complete investigations using rocks and fossils, undertaking the role of a geologist!

Children will identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants. We will explore the requirements of plants for life and growth, as well as explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants.

Art/Design Technology

Our creative curriculum will link closely to the Stone Age, where our first unit of work will be to design and create Stone Age jewellery. We will learn about the history and importance of cave painting and replicate our own cave inspired art, whilst learning about colour and texture.

History and Geography

In geography we will complete a case study around Skara Brae. We will read and draw maps, as well as learn a range of geographical terminology. In history, we will investigate the life of people during the Stone Age and the influence of this era an modern life.

Music

This term we will continue to develop skills when playing the ukulele. Children will learn how to play some basic songs and begin to read musical notation. We will also use Charanga to further develop our glockenspiel playing, from KSI!

This term we continue to learn about the religion of Hinduism. This term we will learn about 'How Hindu's believe', looking at the meanings of Hindu stories and the Hindu Gods.

French

In French we will learn how to say and introduce the names of different family members.

PE

This term we will be going swimming at Tynemouth Pool and carrying out weekly athletics tasks as part of a competition within North Tyneside! We will also be learning how to play rounders, looking at hitting the ball with the bat in one hand, catching the ball and bowling. We will also complete weekly Commando Joe activities.

Computing

In computing we will complete a coding unit using Lego! We will code our robots to complete a range of tasks as part of a Lego League project!
