Did you know!
The Victorian era is often described by historians as the 'Golden Years' as it was a hugely important time for innovation

English

In English this half term, children will write, edit, improve and complete final pieces of writing. We shall use this term's text – 'Street Child' as a stimulus for our writing, in genres such as biographies, persuasive narratives and poetry. Children will revise all areas of grammar and punctuation to ensure they are confident in using them in writing.

Computing

This term children will be learning how to code a Lego robot. The children will be working together to code the robot to complete set tasks.

Science

Our Science topic this term will be 'Electricity'. We will be investigating the variations on circuits and use recognised symbols in a diagram.

Music

During music lessons this term the children will be focusing on musical notation and using this to play short songs on the keyboards.

Mathematics

Throughout this term children will revisit and advance their skills within number, data, measure and shape. We will continue our focus on reasoning and problem solving as well as carrying out extensive practice recalling our existing knowledge of arithmetic facts.

History

Throughout the term, our creative curriculum will make links to our English text. Children will improve their knowledge of The Victorians through our big question 'How did Tyneside change during the Industrial Revolution?' The children will look at how Britain and our local area were changed under Queen Victoria's reign.

French

This half term we will continue our topic of 'Les Vetements'. We will be looking at clothes, descriptive language and forming extended sentences in French.

DT

In DT, we will be looking at the work of William Morris. We will identify the features of the wallpaper he designed before beginning to design our own wallpaper using a success criteria. We will complete research to find out about a customer's needs before selecting tools for block printing our wallpaper. Our final wallpaper will be presented in a sample book!

PE

This term children will have the opportunity in PE to develop their teamwork and invasion skills through hockey whilst also developing individual and lifesaving skills during swimming lessons

RE/PSHE

In the run up to Christmas we will be learning about what the Gospels tell us about the birth of Jesus. We will also be looking at the Lindisfarne Gospels and what they tell us about our local history.

In PSHE our topic is "Getting on and falling out" which will include anti bullying topics and citizenship.
