#### Year 3

#### NUSTEM - Year 1

On Thursday 3rd November Mel from NUSTEM visited school and we became Naval Architects. We made boats out of tin foil before testing them to see if they floated or sunk. We used metal washers to see whose boat could hold the most weight - the winning boat held 24 washers before sinking!







#### Year 3 - Stephenson Railway Museum

On Thursday 3rd November, Year 3 enjoyed a visit to Stephenson Railway Museum as part of our North East Engineering unit in science. We learnt the story of Robert and George Stephenson and their invention of the first steam locomotives. We undertook a range of activities including designing our own trains, explored the museum and completed a practical investigation where we explored which shaped wheel works best on a track.



Technology Tom - Year 4 On Wednesday 2nd November, Technology Tom visited Year 4 to work on our topic of The Romans. Using technology skills, children were able to make Roman siege machines with paper, wooden sticks and an elastic band. Children worked so hard to solve problems and showed such determination - we were extremely impressed.





#### Technology Tom - Year 6

On Wednesday 2nd November we had a workshop with Technology Tom as part of our Electricity science topic. We created our own torches and had to work as a class to create a large one.

Technology Tom had extremely positive praise for our pupils due to their respect and hard work.

#### **Reception visit to Seven Stories**

On Wednesday 23rd November Reception boarded a bus for our first visit of the year. Our destination ... the Seven Stories for a workshop on 'The Case of the Missing Nursery Rhymes' We had to find the clues to solve the missing nursery rhymes. Even with the missing clues we still hadn't completed the case so then we had to perform one of the missing rhymes before finally checking to see if all of the rhymes were back in the book. They were! So we got to listen to some of our favourite rhymes as well as learning some new ones.







We have a number of new starters into school this term, across all phases of school. We are delighted with how they have all settled in to New York so well at such a busy time of year and joined in our various events. Welcome to New York Primary everyone!

#### **Remembrance Assembly**

Year 5 worked really hard to deliver a Remembrance Assembly to the rest of school. We practised reading our lines in loud, clear, confident voices and enjoyed singing Thank You Lord. We wrote poems which were read during the assembly to show our respect and appreciation of those who gave their lives for others. Each year group placed their wreaths and poppies on the cenotaph and a 2 minute silence was held.

#### Anti-Bullying Week

We started the week by wearing odd socks to school. We spoke about how we are all different and how being kind to ourselves and others is important.

#### Reception

Reception read the story 'Kind' by Alison Green and set up a kindness jar in our classroom. Every time we spotted a kind act we popped a pom pom into the jar, and then talked about why the pom pom was in the jar.



#### Year 1

In Year 1 we thought about how kind words can affect our friends mood. We stuck kind words onto our friends photographs before reading these out. The smiles on our faces as we listened to what our friends said about us was lovely!

### Year 2

In Year 2 we saw the effect that unkind words can have on somebody; we also know that reaching out to somebody can really help them. Even if we only greet them with a smile and ask them 'are you okay'? We looked at different scenarios and thought about the best thing we could do to help our friend.

#### Year 3

As part of anti-bullying week, we shared the story Kind by Alex Schleffer. We investigated a range of different scenarios and how we can share kindness in different ways.

#### Year 4

In Year 4, we identified the range of roles associated with bullying and highlighted these in different scenarios. We then discussed who you can reach out to if you are ever involved, in any role, in bullying whether that was at home, school or in public.

#### Year 5

In Year 5, we looked at the different roles that can arise when bullying takes place. We talked about what it means to be a bystander, a ringleader and an assistant and how best we could help someone who is a target of such behaviours. We talked about who we can reach out to for help in school before finally writing our thoughts on the leaves of a tree to represent togetherness.

#### Year 6

As part of anti bullying week in year 6 we thought about the theme 'Reach out'. We discussed why that is important for not only those children who might get bullied but for those who witness it. We spoke about how not to be a bystander and to be someone who reaches out to help. We read a poem about a girl called Samantha Jayne and drew our interpretations of her from the words in the poem. We then thought about how she would feel, and following this we wrote how we could help her to 'reach out'

#### Children in Need

On Friday 18th November we supported Children In Need by decorating biscuits to look like Pudsey. Thank you very much for your kind donations, we raised a grand total of £126 for the charity.



#### Robinwood - Year 6

On 16th November 2022, Year 6 pupils travelled to Robinwood in Cumbria. After a surprisingly fast journey, we set off on our walk up the hill to the Robinwood Centre. Little did we know of the amazing adventure that was waiting for us! Over the next three days, all pupils challenged themselves to complete a variety of activities including Zipwire, Giant Swing and Trapeze. All New York staff were so proud of the resilience and determination shown by all pupils who faced their fears and supported their teammates throughout our time. Pupils behaved impeccably and showed fantastic independence in packing their kit bags, tidying their bedrooms and getting dressed and prepared each morning, ready for the day ahead.
