

Between Monday 19th June and Friday 23rd June, we celebrated our annual STEM week (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). Throughout the week, children took part in a range of activities and workshops that focused around different themes before ending the week with our popular STEM Fair.

### Cell Detectives -Reception and Year 4

Brush Up and Cell Detectives visited school to talk to us about caring for our teeth. We learnt about sugar bugs and looked at these under a microscope! We were given top tips for looking after our teeth and keeping them healthy has your child shared these with you at home?





### Marine Society Workshops - Year 6

During STEM week, we were lucky to welcome Racheal from Dogs Trust to delivery workshops across KS1 and KS2. We learnt lots of new facts and information about dogs, how they act, what types of personalities they might have and ways to approach dogs safely and correctly.






















# LKS2 Beach Trip
