Across school pupils are allocated weekly homework. In every year group, pupils will be given some spellings to learn, some times tables to practise and some topic homework. Spellings and times tables supports pupils basic skills. The topic homework can be chosen from the homework grid that is sent out at the start of the half term. Pupils are given a week to complete and return homework. Sometimes the topic work has a 2 week completion. Completing a homework task is a good habit to get in to. The homework we send out will never be onerous and will always be based around learning that your child has already been working on in school i.e. it will not be new to them. Please support your child's learning by supporting and encouraging them to complete their homework. If there are any issues with homework, please speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance. We are always happy to supply resources to take home. We are hopeful that parents/carers/families will read with their child at home and we send reading books home with pupils to enable this.
